***“Race, Poverty Status, and Diet:
Examining Potential Predictors of
Cognitive Function in the HANDLS Study”***

Dr. Wright’s Biopsychosocial Health and Cognition (BHAC) Lab examines biological, psychological, and social predictors of brain outcomes and cognitive function. She studies cardiovascular risk factors and other markers of chronic disease as well as psychological and social factors that promote or reduce optimal brain and cognitive functioning. Her work is deeply rooted in the examination of health disparities, and she is particularly interested in findings that emerge for vulnerable populations such as African Americans. In this talk, Dr. Wright will present her recent work in the Healthy Aging in Neighborhoods of Diversity across the Life Span (HANDLS) Study.
